Getting Started:

1. What was helpful to you in this week's sermon? What didn't you understand?

Going Deeper

In verse 14, Paul tells the Corinthians to *"flee from idolatry."* What question is Paul (finally!) addressing (see 1 Corinthians 8:1-13; especially verse 10)? Why did the Corinthians assume that eating in an idol's temple was spiritually harmless (10:19; see 8:4-6)? Why does Paul think it is spiritually dangerous (see vv. 20-21)?

- Read vv. 16-18. In what sense is communion a "participation" in the blood of Christ (v. 16)? What analogy is Paul trying to draw between the Lord's Supper and idol meals (compare vv. 16-18 with vv. 20-21)? What kind of "participation" do both share in common? How does this help us understand the spiritual significance of communion?
- 4. Compare verses 19-22 with Deuteronomy 32:15-22. What parallels does Paul see between Israel's experience in the wilderness and the Corinthians' situation?

Application:

- 5. Jeff noted that Christians, though secure in Christ, are not immune from spiritual attacks, or demonic influence. Why is this critical for us to keep in mind?
- 6. Jeff noted a number of ways Satan and demons try to gain access or influence in our lives. Which of these *"open doors"* stood out to you? Where are you most vulnerable/susceptible to spiritual attack?
- 7. Jeff noted a few ways we can experience Christ's deliverance from spiritual attack. Which of these stood out to you? Why?
- 8. What's one thing you can do this week to apply this passage?
