The Discomfort (and Comfort) of God's Judgment

James 5:1-6

A. The Wicked Rich Waste Their Wealth

"Come now, you rich, weep and howl for your miseries which are coming upon you. Your riches have rotted and your garments have become moth-eaten. Your gold and your silver have rusted; and their rust will be a witness against you and will consume your flesh like fire. It is in the last days that you have stored up your treasure!" (James 5:1-3) NASB

B. The Wicked Rich Cheat Others to Become Rich

"Behold, the pay of the laborers who mowed your fields, and which has been withheld by you, cries out against you; and the outcry of those who did the harvesting has reached the ears of the Lord of Sabaoth." (James 5:4) NASB

C. The Wicked Rich Are Blinded by Their Wealth

"You have lived luxuriously on the earth and led a life of wanton pleasure; you have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter. You have condemned and put to death the righteous man; he does not resist you. (James 5:5-6) NASB
