- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 15:8-11. How did the gospel transform Paul? What are areas where the gospel has transformed your life?

Application:

- 5. It can be tempting to build our faith on a foundation other than our identity in Jesus. Is there something that you need to give up? Is there something that has been first importance that needs to be further down the list?
- 6. Are there questions you still have about the truth of the gospel? Are there reliable resources—like *More than a Carpenter* by Josh McDowell or *Case for Christ* by Lee Strobel— that you need to take time to read to answer your own questions or the questions of others?
- 7. If the gospel transforms us by taking steps of faith, are there parts of your life where you need to take a step of faith, but you have been putting it off?
