Getting Started

- 1. What was helpful to you in this week's sermon? What didn't you understand?
- 2. How do people close to you (i.e. neighbors, co-workers, friends) view Jesus? What's their impression of him?

Going Deeper

- 3. 90% of the material in John's gospel is unique to him (i.e. not repeated in Matthew, Mark or Luke). What is John's purpose in writing (see John 20:30-31)? Who is he writing to? Around what time is he writing?
- 4. How does John begin his gospel (John 1:1f)? Compare John 1:1-5 with Genesis 1. How does John invite us to re-imagine the creation account? What is John telling us about Jesus?
- 5. Compare and contrast Moses' encounter with God on Mount Sinai (Exodus 33:18-34:8) with John's encounter with Jesus (John 1:16-18). What similarities do you see between these passages? Why are we, as New Covenant believers, able to grasp the fullness of God's grace even more clearly than Moses could?
- How does John structure the introduction to his gospel (Compare 1:1-5 with 1:16-18, 1:6-8 with 1:15, and 1:9 with 1:14)? What point is he trying to drive home (compare 1:12-13 with John 20:30-31)?

Application

- 7. John describes Jesus as God's final word; God's definitive self-disclosure (see 1:1, 14, 18; 14:9). What implications flow from this? Why can't reason alone, or personal experience alone lead us to knowledge of God? How does this transform the way we approach knowing God?
- 8. What's one thing you can do this week to apply this passage?
