Heavenly or Hellish? Discerning Where Our Words are Coming from (James 3:13-18)

1. "Wisdom" from Below (vv. 14-16)

"But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. ¹⁵ This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶ For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice."

2. Wisdom from Above (vv. 17-18)

"But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace."

Getting Started:

1. What was helpful to you in this week's sermon? What didn't you understand?

2. When you're in a disagreement or conflict with someone, what's your gut reaction? Is it to attack, to avoid, or to do something else? Why do you think that's the case?

Going Deeper:

- 3. According to James, how does a person demonstrate that they are "wise and understanding" (v. 13)? Why did James' congregations need to hear this (compare 3:1)? How should this impact the way we think about selecting leaders in the church (see 1 Timothy 3:1-13)?
- 4. Compare and contrast the "wisdom from above" (vv. 17-18) with the "wisdom" from below (vv. 14-16). How do they differ in essence (compare v. 14 with v. 17), source (compare v. 15 with v. 17) and effect (compare v. 16 with v. 18)? As you compare and contrast these two kinds of wisdom, what stands out to you? Why?
- 5. Compare what James says about the "wisdom from above" (vv. 17-18; see also James 1:5, 17-18) with what Paul says about the Holy Spirit in Galatians 5:22-23. What similarities do you see? Why can't humans (left to themselves) control the tongue (see James 3:7-8, 11-12; compare Jesus' words in Mathew 12:33-34)? What kind of wisdom can only the Spirit of God provide (see 1 Corinthians 2:14-16)?
