For Further Thought and Discussion:

Getting Started:

1. What was helpful to you in this week's sermon? What didn't you understand?

Going Deeper:

- Jesus prays, "As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world." (John 17:18). How did Jesus view his time on earth (See John 4:34; 9:4-5; 17:4)? How should this impact our mindset?
- 3. Why doesn't Jesus pray for *"the world"* (v. 9)? How do we reconcile this statement with God's love for the world (see John 3:16f)? Why does Jesus pray instead for his disciples (see vv. 9-10)?
- 4. What does it mean to be *"holy,"* or *"sanctified"* (these words are closely related in Greek; see vv. 11, 17, 19)? How does being sanctified by God change our relationship with the world? In what sense are disciples of Jesus no longer *"of the world"*? Why is it critical for us to realize that we are set apart *from* the world, *for* the world?
- 5. Why does the world hate those who belong to Jesus (v. 14)? What's the fundamental divide? How does this impact the way we approach mission?

Application:

- 6. Jeff asked three questions to help us develop a missionary mindset: (a) where do I look for belonging? (b) where am I forgetting my calling? (c) am I prepared to take the longview? Which of these stood out to you? Why?
- 7. What's one thing you can do this week to apply this passage?
