The Practice of the Word

A Warning

"But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks at his natural face in a mirror; for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was." (James 1:22-24) NASB

A Promise

"But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the law of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does." (James 1:25) NASB

How to apply what you discover

"All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for <u>teaching</u>, <u>reproof</u>, <u>correction</u> and <u>training in righteousness</u> that the man of God may be adequate and equipped for every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16-17

- For practice, choose one truth you learn from James 1:21-25 and fill in the following. What is the teaching or lesson you learned? Where do you fall short? What will you correct? How will you practice this correction until it becomes a new habit?
